

It goes without saying that 2020 has been a year like no other in modern history and yet the work of Jesus has stayed the same. As I write this, Thanksgiving is only a few days away and I was truly looking forward to spending it with my family but like many of you, we are staying home. As I reflect on this holiday season and the story of Jesus' birth found in Matthew, I am reminded that the lives of Mary, Joseph, and the baby Jesus were in jeopardy. Matthew 2:13 writes: Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "get up, take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him. Each week we will focus on one of the advent candles: watch, wait, wonder, and worship. Our Sunday schoolers will be getting Advent Bags with pictures of candles, each with the theme words on the candle. They are being asked to place the picture of the candle in their front windows as a witness and reminder of Christ coming again. Maybe you'll want to put up your own picture of a candle in your window too.

We will also continue our weekly, Sunday video services and post them on Facebook. For Christmas Eve we plan on doing something new! We will gather at 4:00 pm on Christmas Eve, outside, and will walk to different places around the church. The title of our Christmas Eve service will be: A Walk in Search of the Baby Jesus. Please plan to join us and dress warm!

And then during the week of Christmas, I ask that you share a picture of your nativity scene on our Facebook page. I'll send out a reminder.

These are just a few ways we plan to celebrate as a community as we watch, wait, wonder and worship God for all the wonderful things God has done for us and continues to do during these days. Please know, I continue to hold all of you in prayer.

Let us pray:

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. As darkness fans, may we watch for your light. Keep us awake and alert to your coming and strengthen us to the end, that we may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Dear Friends in Christ,

"So, let us not grow weary in doing what is right..." Galatians 6:9a

While on the run from King Saul, and hiding in the Wilderness of Judah, David wrote these opening words of Psalm 63.

"O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land..."

But it's not just the land that is weary. We too have grown weary. Weary of a contentious election cycle. Weary of cultural divisiveness. Weary of social media posts. Weary of COVID 19 and trying to safely lead a parish through a Global Pandemic. I am particularly weary of trying to find a face covering that keeps my glasses from fogging up. I have not been successful. So, what is making you weary these days?

Last week, I was on a Conference Call with Governor Mike DeWine. He requested the call, because he wanted to reach out to religious leaders in Ohio to provide an update on the COVID19 pandemic. He is concerned about the rising cases of infection, especially in the rural areas of Ohio. He is concerned about the change of seasons and the cooler weather which is moving us into indoor spaces. He is also concerned that we have grown weary of taking the necessary precautions.

On our call Governor DeWine pointed to three seasons that we have experienced with the COVID 19 virus. The spring season of March and April, when we all worked together to "flatten the curve". The summer season of June and July, when urban areas were hit particularly hard, and many of us began to wear face coverings. Governor DeWine argues that the use of face coverings lowered the spread of infections in these summer "hot spots". Now we are in the fall season, and cases are rising in the rural areas of Ohio. Many of these new cases are directly related to large family gatherings, weddings, and in -person worship services. Many of these events are still occurring throughout Ohio without any precautions being taken.

Even when folks take the necessary precautions, the COVID19 virus can find a way. Calvary Lutheran Church in Northwood, Ohio, was recently impacted by the virus and four people were infected. As I talked and prayed with the pastor, he assured me that they worked very hard to take the proper precautions. I am grateful that the four folks who were infected are recovering and gaining their health and strength.

In the Letter to the Galatians, St. Paul reminds us to not grow weary in doing what is right. Dear Friends in Christ, this is not the time to let our guard down and grow weary. Please follow your Parish Plans of Return. Please show some love and grace to your pastors, deacons, and parish leaders, who are trying so very hard to keep you and the community safe. Please do your part as a follower of Jesus to encourage, strengthen, and build up the people around you. So, let us not grow weary of being the people whom God has called us to be.

And at the end of these weary days, I would encourage you to reflect on these words from Jesus:

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30).

Mission Service – Judy Driscoll – Bonnie reported that the pork and sauerkraut dinner went very well. They did 130 meals, all carry out, and sold out. The meal made \$1,527. Thanks to all who helped.

Property – Mike Markley – Janotta and Herner are still working on the new front doors. Gundlach will be in to check the boiler/furnace. The new rails are up on the back step. They look great.

Worship and Music – Sally Warner – Thanksgiving Eve will be via Zoom with Pastor Cathy Schibler. There will be Wednesday Evening Devotions during Advent viz Zoom with Pastor Cathy also. Pastor Cathy will be using Sundays and Seasons lessons for Advent. Christmas Eve service will be at 4:00 pm only. It will be an outdoor only service with the congregation moving through four different scenes of the birth of Jesus. Sunday services are still being videoed on Friday mornings.

New Business – Tim Miller's 40^{th} Anniversary of his ordination is on December 14. Carol will place it in the Newsletter and encourage members to send cards. Jim made a motion that the council send a card from them. 2^{nd} by Mike. Motion passed.


