When I was in elementary school we learned highlights of history. I was sure that I would have been an abolitionist during the Civil War and would have been involved with the underground railroad. When we read The Diary of Anne Frank, I knew I wanted to be like the family that helped hide them. When I heard about people banning and burning books (HORROR to a young bookworm!) I was aghast and couldn't believe that people would think a book was so bad it needed to be burned instead of ignored. And then, I got older and was naturally oblivious to the world. I knew about the Berlin wall falling, I saw the picture of the guy standing in front of a tank in China, I was scared of the radiation cloud that might come from Chernobyl. Yet, in all honesty, those things passed me by along with so many other things.. (The Challenger explosion was a different story) The first war in Iraq started on my birthday so I was aware of that, but I was so busy with the immediate things of my life that I thought very little of world events going on. Even in college, it was the early days of the internet. News was either presented on TV, magazines, or newspapers; not something that a college student at the time really paid much attention to. I saw more of the world news and listened but never thought beyond my small world. We didn't have instant news, and all my views came from only the lens that the American media presented.

Today, news is instant. Videos are recorded by EVERYONE and we can see the world through so many different lenses. In reflection, I realize that I probably wouldn't have been one of the heroes in history. More than likely I'd have been quietly overwhelmed with the daily tasks of living and with the ideas of the community I was raised in. I had very little exposure to people, ideas, cultures, foods, faiths, and more that differed from my small bubble. Yet with college, seminary, and life experiences my small bubble has grown so much larger. I have the ability to see and hear the world in so many different ways. The bubble that we live in is only as small as we allow it to be. You have to actually work at ignoring things sometimes. And I know for our daily lives, sometimes we desperately need to make our bubble small so that the enormity of the world doesn't overwhelm us. Still, I wonder if 9-year-old me would hear my reactions to the world's history and be embarrassed that I didn't do or say more. As naive and idealistic as 9-year-old me was, she knew what side she wanted to be on. How easy it is to let the problems of this world just be watched on videos, have memes, thoughts, and prayers shared and then we move on.

I don't have the answers to the world's problems. Dear friends, this is when the Sunday school answer of "Jesus" doesn't cut it alone. As a follower of Christ, Jesus is my example, model, and so much more of course. My faith is what leads me into the belief of the intrinsic value of every human life, it has convicted me to stand with the outsider, it is what empowers my hope, and makes me want to be that kind of person that the 9-year-old me would want to cheer on. If Jesus is the answer, it means that my hands, feet, mind, heart need to be *doing* the work. Shouting from the sidelines John 3:16 helps no one! (And that is NOT what it means to be unashamed of the gospel) If Jesus is the answer, I must remember that I am the body of Christ, and it is that which is meant to compel me to action. If I want to be unashamed of the gospel, I must stand with the oppressed, the outsider, the hurt, the hungry, the ones with no power. If I want Jesus to be the answer, then it is my responsibility to live the answer.

I can't always tell what I should be doing about the world's problems. I don't have the ability to drop everything of my immediate life and give myself completely to one cause or another. I don't have the billions of dollars to influence the world in a way that would be closer aligned to justice and righteousness. And I certainly don't want the arrogance of simply proclaiming that Jesus is the answer, saying a prayer, and shaking my head when the world doesn't like me. What I can do is break my heart open and do what I can. I may never be a hero of history, but I don't want to be found complicit because of my silence, fear, or hopelessness. I still believe that love and kindness can change the world.




