### TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - November 21, 2024 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Pat Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, P. Jen, Carrie Wiedenheft, Barb Sessler, Betsy Stierhoff, Nancy Vollmer, Gayle Thompson and Secretary Carol Dahs Absent: Kathy Bango and Bill Bertsch

Meeting called to order by President – Carrie Wiedenheft — Opening devotions were given by Nancy Vollmer

Minutes of previous meeting (October 2024) were reviewed. Pat made a motion to accept the October meeting minutes with the correction under Young at Heart that decoration should be decorating and under New Business the job will be offered at \$18-\$19/hour and not \$17. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Betsy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for September and October were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to approve.  $2^{nd}$  by Betsy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Pastor Jen reviewed the secretary opening. They had two viable candidates and decided to go with Gayle Thompson. Gayle shadowed Carol for two days to see what she thought of the position. Unfortunately, Gayle decided it wasn't a good fit for her. P. Jen will contact the second candidate, Stephanie, and see if she wants to job shadow a day with Carol. Jim made a motion to offer a qualified candidate \$18,720 annually with a \$.50 raise after a 6-month probation period. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Nancy. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report: P. Jen is continuing with hospital and care center visitations. She has had two funerals over the last month. Carrie and P. Jen met with the youth to talk about fundraising for their 2027 trip. The group also have given themselves a name, GLOW – God's Love Our World. P. Jen thanked P. Ann Marshall for filling in for her. P. Jen did a Christmas Trivia event at Zion Huron last week. It was lots of fun and the team she was on won! Would like to see more Trinity folks participate next year. She also met with Chris from "The Center". They had a great meeting and P. Jen is excited to partnership with them on different activities that they are hoping to do. She also asked if Trinity could be a "Diapers & Wipes" church for them. This would mean collecting diapers and wipes a couple time a year to help support The Center and their work.

Congregational Life – The monthly cookie gathering was discussed and it was decided to continue this project into 2025. There will be a notice placed in the December Newsletter. The hope is to get some new volunteers to bring cookies. Carrie will talk to Sally Warner about becoming the chair for the Congregational Life team since Kathy did not run again.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – The kids will be hosting the annual Senior Thanksgiving meal in November and will be performing their Christmas program on December 8.

Community Mission –Betsy Stierhoff – The chili cookoff went well and would like to do it again next year. The cornbread, muffins and brownies helped complete the meal. They are talking of doing a similar event in the spring with soup. They will be doing their annual Good Gifts Tree and the Seats and Feets tree. The ThankOffering boxes will be replaced with just ThankOffering envelopes to help avoid all the change to count.

Property –The parsonage garage door opener has been installed and P. Jen is very grateful. Jim has another name for Bill to see if we can get the window in the parsonage fixed. Joe Bodi isn't responding very quickly. Council approved a facility use form for Betsy Stierhoff on December 14.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer/Barb Sessler – On December 1 will be the Hanging of the Greens at 11:30 am. Dress in casual clothes. December 3 at 1:00 pm after the late service will be their next meeting to discuss 2025.

Young at Heart – Nancy Vollmer – Sixteen people went to the November 9 Harlequin Play. It was enjoyed by all. On December 2 at 11:30 am they will be going to the Senior Center for lunch and then the Edison Choir will perform. Those wishing to go must sign up this coming Sunday.

Old Business – The new frames and Pastor pictures are now up and looking great in the office. Thanks Bonnie and Barb.

New Business – Ebenezer Church of Assembly of God out of Willard is looking for a space to have a weekly bilingual service here in the evening. Council discussed and suggested that they come see the space we have and see if it would work for what they are looking to do and then to give us some literature on themselves.
