





## *A note from Pastor Jen*



Dear Church,

When faith or religion is used as justification for power or authority, it is being misused. When Christianity is used to exclude, dominate, or judge, it strays far from the message of Jesus. Throughout history, we have seen examples of this happening. This month, we will journey together through Holy Week again where we see Jesus teach us that God comes to bring

sacrificial love, endless mercy, and boundless grace. Jesus never sought earthly power. On Maundy Thursday, we see Jesus teaching us to humble ourselves in service to the world. On Good Friday, we see Jesus show us how far sacrificial love and grace will go in order to restore and transform our relationship with God. Holy Week calls us to turn our eyes to the work and wonder of God's amazing love.

This love doesn't end on Friday. We gather on Sunday to proclaim that love cannot be killed, love cannot be ended, and that even death cannot stop God's love from breaking into the world and offering transformation. God's love has never been meant as something to be forced but rather a gift and a promise. In Christ's resurrection we are offered a vision of the kingdom of God that breaks into our lives and transforms us. Our trust is in God's grace that we cannot earn nor do we deserve but is yet given without reservation or conditions. ALLELUIA! This is a gift that can only be celebrated – not forced. Beloveds, let us celebrate! With the gift of Easter Joy, may be filled with hope so that we too can offer love, mercy, and grace. With hearts filled with hope and lives transformed by grace, may we bring God's loving touch into our world by loving our neighbor, welcoming the stranger, and caring for those in need.

# COUNCIL UPDATE

## TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - March 20th 2025 - 7:00 pm (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Pat Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, PR. Jen, Carrie Wiedenheft, Barb Sessler, Betsy Stierhoff, Nancy Vollmer, and Secretary Stephanie Lehr

Meeting called to order by President Carrie Wiedenheft  
Opening devotions were given by Pastor Jen

Minutes of previous meeting (February 2025) were reviewed. Correction to Treasurer's Report: "A motion was made for Jim and/or Shannon to be authorized to take money from Thrivent Financial accounts for church use. Bill motioned to approve; Betsy 2<sup>nd</sup>. \$7,500 sent to local charities from Community Mission." The possibility of approving minutes before publication was discussed. Pat motioned to approve the correction; Barb 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Treasurer's report: Jim suggested withdrawing \$20,000 from Trivent Bond account and transfer current fund account due to deficient.

President's Report: Carrie received more evaluations.

Pastor's Report: P. Jen noted excellent turnout for Lent services. There was a funeral for Jane Lehrer and a baptism for Alexandria Grace-Lynn Otto. PR. Jen is attempting to engage Sunday school children for attendance. The Mission Director @ Providence Commons will engage their residents for Trinity's 10:30 service. PR. Jen -- a Protestant service once a month @ the Commons.

Congregational Life (Sally Warner): Sally offered extensive critical commentary about the newsletter and baptism certificates. The PB&J event was successful. Portraits of members after Easter service will be offered. There was a concern about debris in bulletins; PR. Jen will announce at the following worship. Sally convened with Stephanie about producing envelopes for funeral homes. The Portland Place permanently closed in January and will be removed in the newsletter.

Faith Builders (Pat Wiedenheft): The American Legion vendor show and its interest was discussed. The Youth Candy sale will have chocolate Oreos, cake pops, etc. Applied for Thrivent Card to cover cost.

Community Mission (Betsy Stierhoff): Meeting date not decided. The school supplies totaled 62 glue sticks, 34 regular glue, 86 Post-Its, 72 highlighters, 2 paper bundles, and 2 packages of markers.

Property: PR. Jen offered extensive discussion about the roof. Lifetime Quality from Independence, OH surveyed current roof damage via drone. It was not yet determined to move forward with hiring.

Stewardship and Finance (Jim Bertsch): The 2024 Audit Report was discussed.



Worship and Music (Nancy Vollmer/Barb Sessler): 25 were served during Ash Wed luncheon. Adele discussed the organ blower cover.

Young at Heart (Nancy Vollmer): Spring Banquet @ Ehoove Young Chef's Inn on 4/9/25, 12pm. The Last Supper is currently playing at Cinemark and members may meet for the 2:15pm showing on Sunday.

Old Business: Stephanie had Janotta & Herner inspect the front door lock. It was determined to be functional; the right door requires extra force for opening.

New Business: Upstairs Gathering room renovation. The committee includes Sally Warner, Barb Sessler, Bill Bertsch, and Bonnie Lieb. Minutes from the committee's March 17 meeting were distributed. The projector unit was discussed. Pat motioned to move forward with estimates, Nancy 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Council Thank-yous: Financial Audit Group: Linda Gantz, Bonnie Lieb, Sally Warner, Shannon Limberios, Jim Bertsch, and Stephanie Lehr; PR. Jen, Linda Gantz, and Pat Wiedenheft for helping with Crossroads.

April's council meeting will be April 10<sup>th</sup>. Barb moved to adjourn, Betsy 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion passed.
